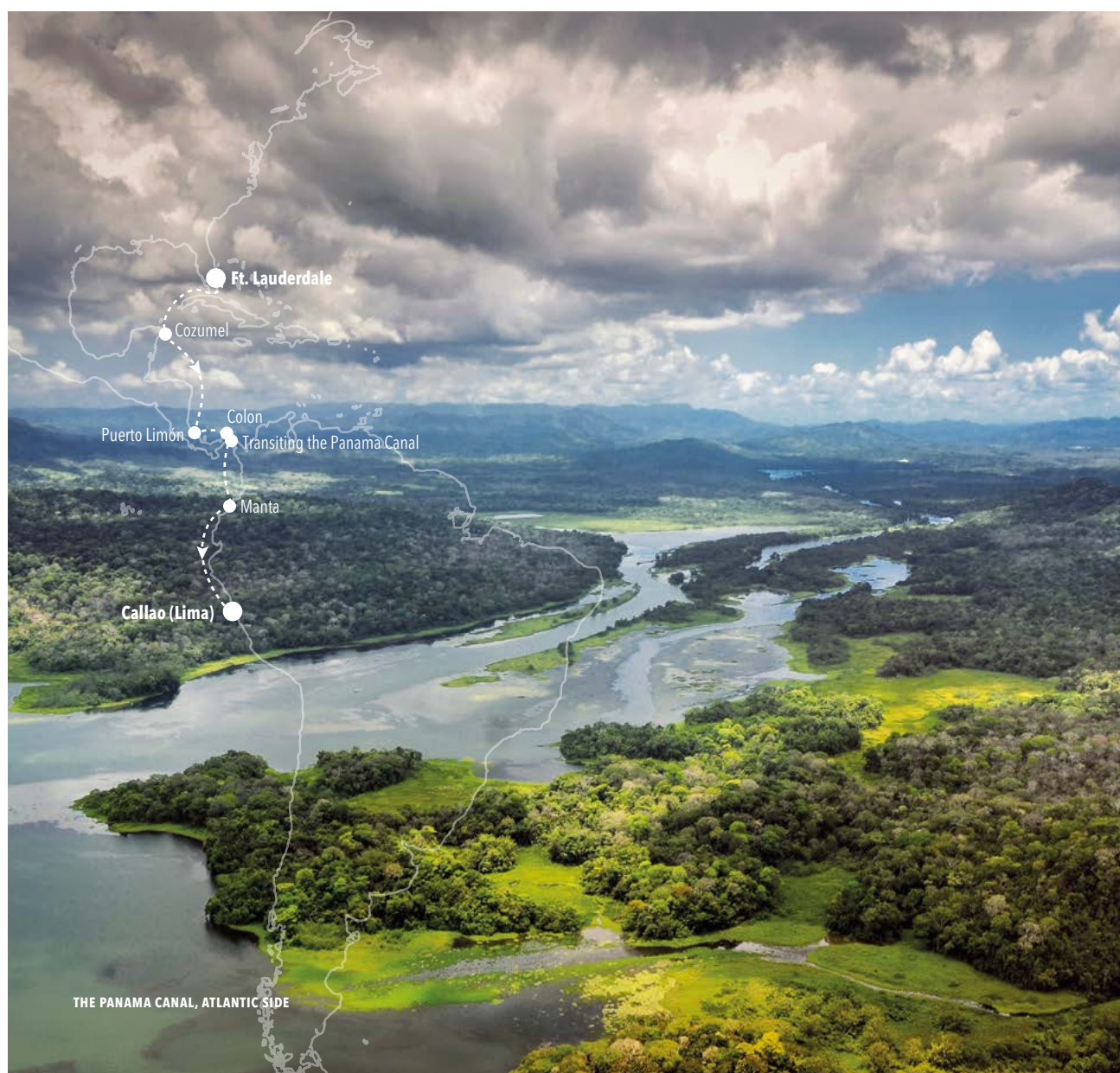

PUERTO LIMÓN (COSTA RICA) / 11 January

Home to a large Afro-Costa Rican community, Puerto Limón is a captivating melting pot of peoples and influences, and is the place where Christopher Columbus first dropped anchor to explore this part of the world. Throughout their long and rich history, the town's *barrios* have seen more than their fair share of settlers, explorers, and, rumour has it, even pirates.



PANAMA CANAL TRANSIT (PANAMA) / 13 January

The only waterway in the world where East becomes West, the world-famous *Canal de Panamá* is 82 kilometres of seagoing history. For millennia, the world's navigators and explorers were forced to travel the lengthy and hazardous route around the southern tip of South America but only in the past century has this engineering marvel made this remarkable crossing possible every day.



MANTA (ECUADOR) / 15 January

An entirely new destination for our World Cruise, Manta is a scenic port also known as *San Pablo de Manta*. A trading post since pre-Colombian times, its irregular streets are full of quaint shops and restaurants, especially along the picturesque seaside *Avenida Malecón*. Just around the corner, wide and sweeping beaches such as *El Murciélagu* lie idle under endless blue skies.

MOAI STATUES, EASTER ISLAND, CHILE

EASTER ISLAND (CHILE) / 25-26 January

One of the most remote inhabited islands in the world, *la Isla de Pascua* is a magical place of unique culture, rugged landscapes and singular history. Set against a backdrop of glistening turquoise waters and majestic volcano craters, the island's mysterious and ancient 1000 Moai statues are up to 22 metres tall: a UNESCO World Heritage Site you'll never forget.



HIVA OA ISLAND, FRENCH POLYNESIA

NUKU HIVA (FRENCH POLYNESIA) / 1 February

The largest of the French Polynesian Marquesas islands, Nuku Hiva was made famous by novelist Herman Melville who was held captive here by natives in 1842. You, on the other hand, will be captivated by the magnificence of this rarely visited destination as you follow in Melville's footsteps to explore the intimate beaches of a South Pacific island like no other.



MAUPITI ISLAND, FRENCH POLYNESIA

BORA BORA (FRENCH POLYNESIA) / 6 February

An extinct volcano surrounded by a lagoon and coral reef, this island's name in ancient Tahitian – *Pora pora mai te pora* – meant "created by the gods". They must have loved art, as the bays of Bora Bora are painted in a kaleidoscope of colours: dark indigo for deeper waters, blue and green pastels closer to shore, and coral reefs in thousands of reds, blues and purples.

TREASURE ISLANDS



NORFOLK ISLAND, SOUTH PACIFIC, AUSTRALIA

Several first-time world cruise destinations, including Noumea in New Caledonia and Nuku'alofa in Tonga, make this an itinerary to remember. Names such as Mystery Island and Norfolk Island evoke the legacies of explorers who sailed thousands of kilometres to reach this part of the world, from Magellan to Bligh. And you'll be visiting at a time when the entire region comes alive with festivals celebrating local customs, music and dance.



AITUTAKI (COOK ISLANDS) / 9 February

This secluded island is an “almost atoll”, as it’s actually an immense lagoon encircled by land and reef. 15 *motus* (islets) are scattered across the lagoon with most of them made entirely of coral. This creates a magical atmosphere where coconut palm trees sway over crystal clear turquoise waters, and multi-coloured coral reefs host unique species of fish and turtles.



SAVUSAVU (FIJI) / 15 February

Thanks to its sunlit charm, Savusavu is the quintessential tropical paradise. From hot springs to pearl farms to majestic waterfalls, the island is a rare mix of sublime natural features. With more palm trees than people, and over 250 species from around the world found throughout its gardens and beaches, you’ll always feel like you’re in a picture-perfect postcard.



LIFOU (NEW CALEDONIA) / 18 February

An entirely new destination for our World Cruise, Lifou is largely untouched and unspoiled. One of the best kept secrets of the Pacific, each of its beaches offers up something a bit different, from immaculate white sand and calm waters to magnificent cliffs overlooking picturesque bays. A small island paradise to discover and rediscover.

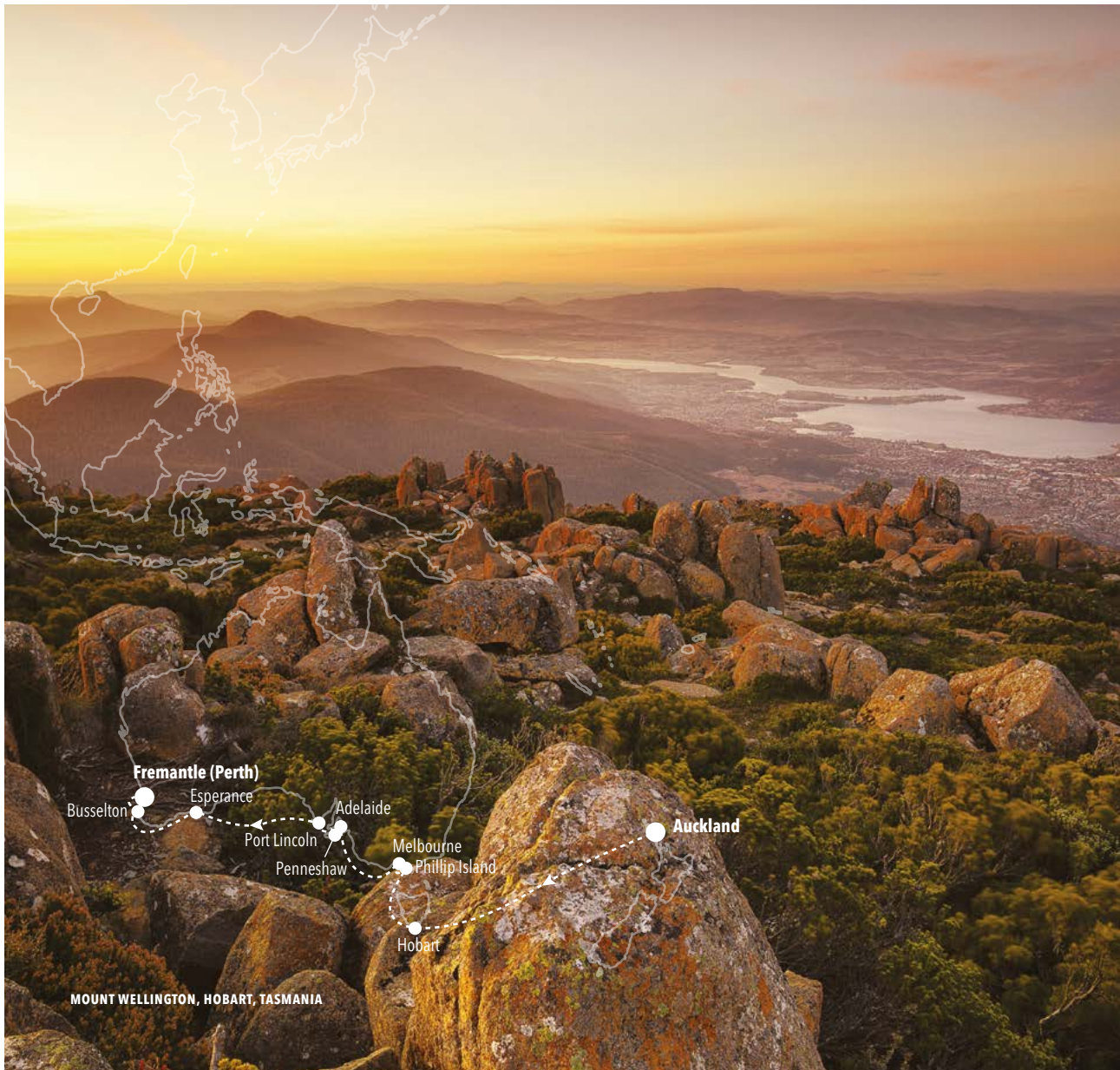

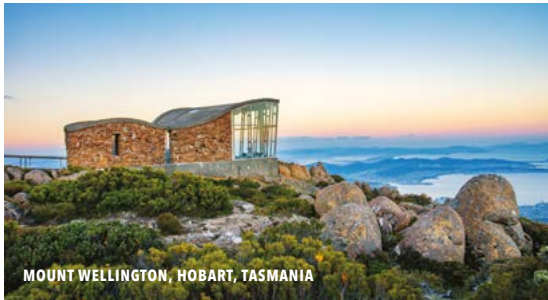

HOBART, TASMANIA (AUSTRALIA) / 1-2 March

A penal colony in times gone by, Hobart is Australia's second-oldest city and one of the world's most beautiful harbours. Encircled by dramatic cliffs, landscaped gardens, wavy mountains and endless ocean views, it must be seen to be believed. Generous sunshine and cool Antarctic breezes conspire to create some highly acclaimed wines, including several fabulous Pinot Noirs.



PORT LINCOLN, SOUTH AUSTRALIA

PORT LINCOLN (AUSTRALIA) / 8 March

A new world cruise destination, Port Lincoln features a coastal wilderness like no other, from craggy limestone cliffs to large sand dunes. Here you'll get up close and personal with penguins and visit Coffin Bay National Park, a place that, despite its name, teems with life and is home to some of the world's most succulent oysters and seafood.



CAPE LE GRAND, ESPERANCE, W. AUSTRALIA

ESPERANCE (AUSTRALIA) / 11 March

Esperance is a fabulous new addition to our World Cruise. The town's name means "hope" in French, in contrast with the original Nyungar name, *Kepa Kurl*, meaning "where the water lies like a boomerang". No matter how you call it, you'll get to enjoy the island's crystal clear waves and white sand beaches, many located inside nature reserve Cape Le Grand National Park.

NUSA PENIDA, KLUNGKUNG REGENCY, BALI, INDONESIA

Your Australia journey continues as we sail on to the craggy coastlines of the west and north-west, a largely pristine and unexplored part of the world. You'll see "Mars by the sea", the UNESCO World Heritage Ningaloo Reef coral gardens, and the Kimberley coast where time stands still. Uninhabited valleys and gorges rise up to meet high plateaus overlooking majestic waterfalls and gorgeous cliffs, all unchanged for millions of years. Then you'll move on to explore the islands of Indonesia, including breathtaking Bali.



BROOME (AUSTRALIA) / 19 March

At the heart of Australia's wild and unspoiled Kimberley Coast, Broome is all about picturesque bays, clear turquoise waters and beaches made of the finest sands, often entirely untouched. You'll encounter flora and fauna that have managed to flourish like nowhere else, as this area is one of the most uninhabited places in the world.



DARWIN (AUSTRALIA) / 22 March

A former outpost for ancient explorers, Darwin is now the capital of Australia's Northern Territory and the gateway to massive Kakadu National Park, a timeless place of sparkling waterfalls and deep canyons, rich with hidden wildlife. The city itself is full of culture and excitement, with multi-ethnic cuisine, colourful markets and a year-round laid-back holiday vibe.



BENOA, BALI (INDONESIA) / 26 March

Benoa is the best of Bali, with incredible blue-green waters, a large variety of fascinating marine wildlife, and an occasional glimpse at traditional Balinese life through the area's temples and fishing villages. At the northern end of the peninsula is *Pasar Desa Pakraman*, a market where local fishermen sell their daily catch from early in the morning all the way to midnight.

CHINESE FISHING NETS, FORT KOCHI, KERALA, SOUTH INDIA

Inspired by the ancient sea routes linking East and West, this itinerary touches upon five countries, all part of the historic Ancient Silk Road and Maritime Spice Routes. They all played a central role in the economic, cultural and political interactions between different peoples of the time. And they still do. This South Asian chapter features several extended stays and a deeper look at destinations ashore, including late departures from Trincomalee and Colombo, as well as overnights in Cochin and Singapore.



SINGAPORE (SINGAPORE) / 30-31 March

This island city-country is a heady blend of yesterday and tomorrow, with sparkling high-rises towering over traditional outdoor street markets. Your overnight stay will allow you to enjoy the many layers of this unique metropolis, and take in magical views over the Singapore Straits, the bay's canopy of amazing gardens, and world-renowned Supertree Grove.



GALLE (SRI LANKA) / 9 April

Galle looks like a block of paradise carved into the southwest sea of Sri Lanka, with straight-edged beaches and shores that host a myriad of ancient monuments to navigation, including the Galle Lighthouse, Dutch Fort and Maritime Museum. Active since before Ancient Roman times, this ancient seaport is a distinctive mix of influences, peoples and stories.



COCHIN (INDIA) / 12-13 April

A vital spice trading centre for the entire west coast of India from the 14th century onwards, *Kochi* was nicknamed "Queen of the Arabian Sea" by early navigators. Ruled by, or allied with, a variety of empires throughout its history – including the Chinese, Portuguese, Dutch and British – its wealth of cultural influences has shaped the odd streets and alleyways of this intriguing city.

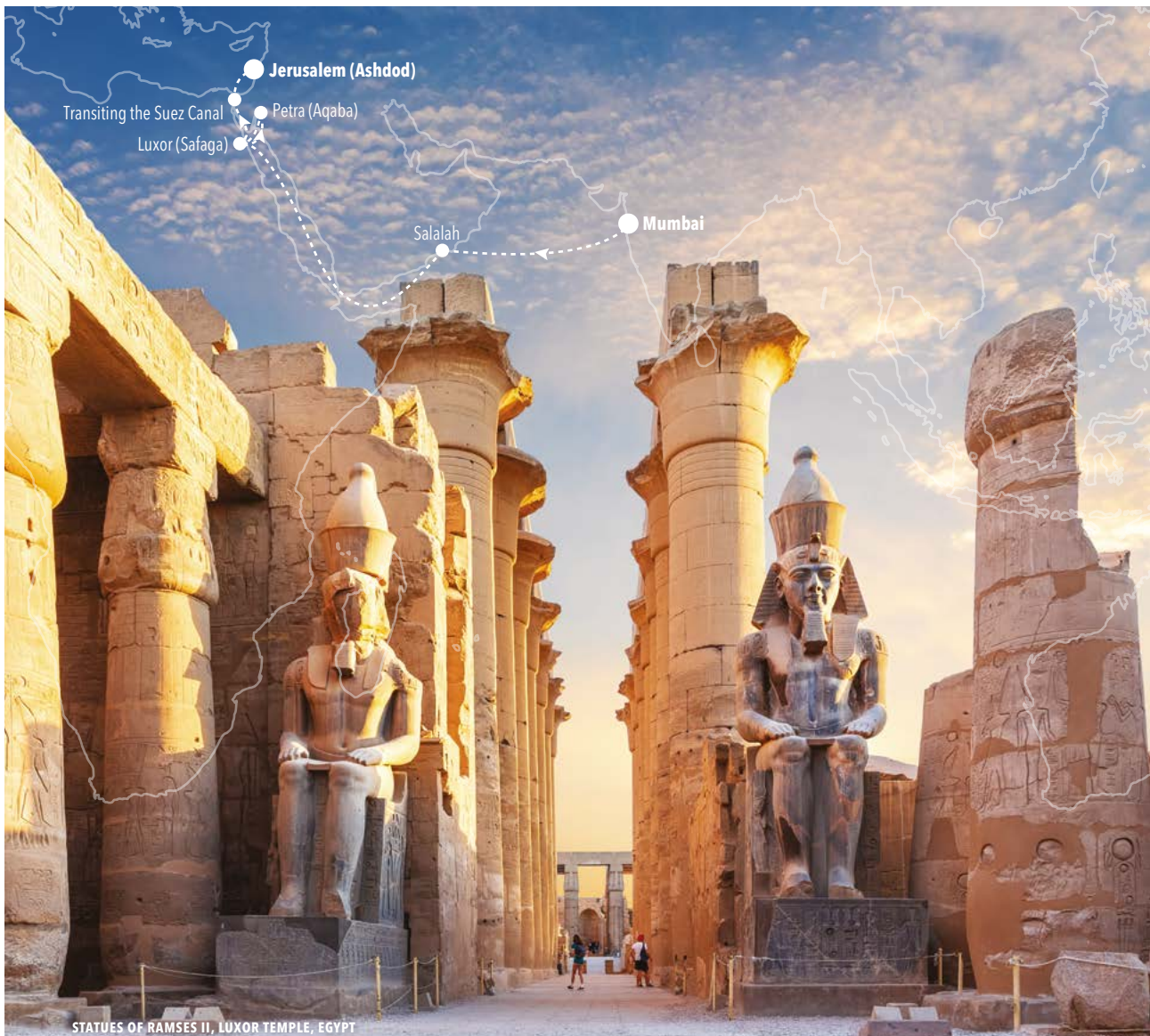
MARTIAL ARTS, KERALA, SOUTH INDIA

MUMBAI (INDIA) / 15-16 April

From street vendors to high-street shops, traditional cuisine to experimental fare, Mumbai has everything the curious voyager is looking for. The capital of India and of Indian culture, it is one of the most multi-layered cities in the world, with ancient temples spilling out onto lush green parks next to sparklingly glass high-rises.



SAFAGA, LUXOR (EGYPT) / 25-26 April

Often called "the world's greatest open-air museum", Luxor is a site to behold. Bright orange temples and columns are set against the bluest of skies. The sheer size of these monuments is indescribable; they simply must be seen. As the ancient capital of the Egyptian pharaohs, it features structures more than 3,400 years old standing at attention waiting to be explored.



SUEZ CANAL TRANSIT / 29 April

Crossing the Suez Canal is the sailing adventure of a lifetime. Built in 1869, this feat of engineering shaved almost 7,000 kilometres off the route for sailors travelling between Asia and Europe. As you sail towards the Mediterranean, you'll experience incredible scenery, from the lush foliage of the Nile Delta to the west, to the vastness of the Sinai Peninsula desert to the east.

MEDITERRANEA



DUBROVNIK VIEWED FROM THE WALLS, CROATIA

Next you'll visit the ancient city of Nazareth, with its captivating architecture, millennial customs and traditions, all framed by its biblical history. Then you'll foot upon two of Greece's most well-known islands, Rhodes and Crete, the latter welcoming us at Aghios Nikolas, a new world cruise destination. And as if one marvellous sea isn't enough, you'll also explore the Adriatic, known for its breathtaking coastline made of lush green hills that dive into crystal-clear waters.



RHODES (GREECE) / 5 May

Known for its stunning bays and beaches, impressive ancient ruins and colourful Old Town, Rhodes is an island hideaway like no other. The citadel, built by the Order of Knights of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, or Hospitallers for short, is one of the best-preserved medieval towns in all of Europe and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.



SARANDE (ALBANIA) / 10 May

A new destination for our World Cruise, Sarande is a small seaside harbour featuring vast vistas and a lovely seaside promenade that spans the entire town. The gateway to the Albanian Riviera, it's a place where explorers have made their mark over and over again, while the area changed hands and empires, from Byzantine to Greek to Ottoman.



DUBROVNIK (CROATIA) / 11 May

A charming medieval city poised on the edge of a rocky outcrop overlooking the water, Dubrovnik is a sight to see. All this is set like a gem in the blue-green stone of the Eastern Adriatic.

Connecting Europe to the Middle East and North Africa, it's a place steeped in history, some of which you'll discover as you explore its narrow alleyways, colourful streets and seaside avenues.



LA GOULETTE, TUNIS (TUNISIA) / 20 May
